2.5.2 Mechanism to deal with internal/external examination related grievances is transparent, time-bound and efficient

The University of Mumbai's internal and external examination regulations are always followed by the college.

The internal evaluation is conducted at the postgraduate and undergraduate levels in accordance with University of Mumbai regulations.

For 40% of the total grade for each paper in each semester, Continuous Internal Evaluation is conducted by all postgraduate departments. This system of evaluation comprises many test formats, including presentations, assignments, projects, viva-vice, and class tests. Teachers give students plenty of notice regarding the format of internal examination.

Examinations at the end of terms practicals and assignments make up internal evaluations for undergraduate students. Practical exams are held frequently and in accordance with a timetable that has been carefully established and effectively communicated. The students receive adequate instruction in carrying out the prescribed practicals, and all required practicals are carried out.

Students are so equipped to succeed in practical examination. At the end of the first term, examinations are given. Each term involves finishing the term-wise syllabus that the affiliating university has set forth. The internal examinations are administered using the same format as the final examination. To maintain uniformity and openness, the college conducted its internal review concurrently across all of its streams. According to university standards, every teacher conducts fair evaluations. After review, the moderation process is carried out in accordance with university standards.

The student may speak with the concerned professor or exam committee to address any grievances as needed.

The college examination committee performs the evaluation job for external examination.

Students who are unsatisfied with their grades can request a photocopy of the answer sheet for the relevant subject after the results are announced. After the results are announced, the student can apply for rechecking or revaluation by filling out forms and submitting them along with the university fees to request a rechecking or revaluation. For examination at the college level, the exam committee appoints a subject expert to reevaluate the subject. The student's reassessment result is then assessed and displayed in a timely manner.
