## ANALYSIS ON STUDENT SATISFACTION SURVEY

 FEEDBACK FORM ON TEACHING-LEARNING PROCESS ACADEMIC YEAR: 2022-23
## INTRODUCTION:

Feedback is a two-way dialogue which helps the institute to go further. Regulatory bodies have mandate to set norms and standards for regulating the quality of educational institutes. Bodies like UGC and NAAC have policies and procedures to orient India's Education system to quality.
The feedback collected from the individuals has been analysed and taken to the consideration for the development of teaching learning process.

## STUDENT SATISFACTION SURVEY:

We have collected online survey from our under graduate students and post graduate students. The University collects the feedback on teaching learning process from stakeholders such as the students through online.

## CLASS:

The following chart shows the feedback status of all the classes.


According to the above pie chart, $1 \%$ of the students in the MA Part II gave their feedback on the class. $3 \%$ of the students in the MA Part I gave their feedback on the class. $9 \%$ of the students in the MCOM Part I gave their feedback on the class. 3\% of the students in the MCOM Part II gave their feedback on the class.1\% of the students in the MSc.IT Part I gave their feedback on the class. $2 \%$ of the students in the MSc.IT Part I gave their feedback on the class. Only $26 \%$ of the students in the First Year gave feedback on their Class. Only $41 \%$ of the students in the Second Year gave feedback on their Class. Only 13\% of the students in the Third Year gave feedback on their Class.

## COURSE:

Students of the first year, second year, and third year undergraduate classes of Arts, Commerce and Science Faculty, and the postgraduate first year and second-year classes of Arts submitted their survey related to the teaching-learning process. The following chart shows the feedback status of all the courses.


In the academic session of 2021-22, a random group of 200-300 students was asked to complete the "Student Satisfaction Survey" included 17 questions regarding academics and overall facilities provided in college, assessment of teaching quality and teaching environment was part of survey. The interpretation of overall survey is as follows.

## SYLLABUS COVERED IN THE CLASS:

## Q.1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?



While evaluating the question on the syllabus, 'How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?' In answering this question $25 \%$ of students commented that the syllabus is 50 to $60 \%$ covered in the class, while $35 \%$ of students said that the syllabus is 60 to $70 \%$ covered and $40 \%$ of students commented that the syllabus is above $80 \%$ covered.

## TEACHERS PREPARE FOR THE CLASSES:



As shown in the above chart, $58 \%$ of student think teachers prepare satisfactorily, $23 \%$ of students think teachers prepare thoroughly, $14 \%$ of students think teachers prepare poorly, $5 \%$ of students think teachers prepare indifferently.

As shown in the above pie chart, $78 \%$ of students agree that the teachers are able to communicate. $6 \%$ of students remained not sure from this question. $16 \%$ of students do not agree with the above statement.

YOUR PERFORMANCE IN ASSIGNMENTS DISCUSSED WITH YOU:


As shown in the above pie chart, about $43 \%$ students approved that their performance in assignments is discussed every time. About $20 \%$ and $4 \%$ of students think their performance is discussed usually and sometimes, respectively. Only $25 \%$ students voted for rarely, and $8 \%$ students voted for never.

## THE INSTITUTE TAKES ACTIVE INTEREST IN PROMOTING INTERNSHIP, STUDENT EXCHANGE, FIELD VISIT OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENTS:



As shown in the above pie chart, about $37 \%$ students approved that the institution takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, and field visit opportunities for them regularly, whereas $10 \%$ students opted for often. About 26\% students reveal that institute takes active interest sometimes. Only 6\% students opted for rarely and $21 \%$ students opted for never.

# THE TEACHERS IDENTIFY YOUR STRENGTHS AND ENCOURAGE YOU WITH PROVIDING RIGHT LEVEL OF CHALLENGES: 



About 58\% students fully agree that the teacher identifies their strength and encourage them with providing right level of challenges, and $30 \%$ students reasonably agree. About $8 \%$ students partially agree and $1 \%$ students agree slightly. Only $3 \%$ students think that the teacher is unable to identify their strength and encourage them with providing right level of challenges.

THE INSTITUTION MAKES EFFORT TO ENGAGE STUDENTS IN THE MONITORING, REVIEW AND CONTINUOUS QUALITY IMPROVEMENT OF THE TEACHING LEARNING PROCESS:




About $46 \%$ students agree that to a great extent Effort are made by the institution or teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make them ready for the world of work. Moderate efforts were observed by $34 \%$ students and 5\% students opted for somewhat. Only $12 \%$ students observed very little efforts and $3 \%$ opted for not at all.

Around $12 \%$ of students rated for above $90 \%$, while $28 \%$ of students rated for $70-89 \%$, whereas $25 \%$ of students rated for $50-69 \%$ and $35 \%$ students rated for $30-49 \%$.
